Before you begin, remember the 'year' you belong to is the Year 7 or Form 1 year of your group, so even if you graduated in 1966, you should find your name in 1961.

All 'years' are found on the right of the screen under 'tags'.

Click on your year list and, hopefully you will see a list of your mates (and some you probably can't remember!). If you want to read any comments attached to your year level (and remember there are heaps of memories from the Reunion) you will need to click on "comment" — you will find this at the bottom of the list.

You may come from an era where you studied 'HSC' and are not sure what students get up to these days. Students have quite a few choices now, including:

- VCE (Victorian Certificate of Education) is for students who (may) want to go to University and who enjoy theory and homework.
- VCAL (Victorian Certificate of Applied Learning) is for students who
- are more "hands on" and are likely to go into a trade or traineeship (and who don't like too much theory or homework!).
- VET (Vocational Education & Training) is a subject (Certificate II or III) which is delivered by another provider (usually a TAFE) and can include subjects like hospitality, engineering, automotive, plumbing, electrical etc.
- VCAL & VET complement each other as they are both 'hands-on'.
- ASBA (Australian School Based Apprenticeship) is a part-time apprenticeship. This usually means the student attends school 3-4 days a week and works, as an apprentice, 1-2 days per week.

43 Year 12 students in 2008 tackled the VCE (Victorian Certificate of Education) or VCAL (Victorian Certificate of Applied Learning).

This year level was ably led by the College Captains Candice Groves and Brady Nichols with assistance from Vice Captains Kirby Sprunt and Glen Gamble (pictured to the right).

18 students applied for higher education courses and 12 successfully received offers for their preferred course. Students chose from a diverse range of interest areas including Podiatry, Environmental Science, Education, Engineering (Civil),

Occupational Therapy, Psychological Science and Health Science.

The Universities / TAFES the students chose were LaTrobe Bendigo (4), Charles Sturt (Albury-Wodonga (3), Victoria University – Melton, RMIT Point Cook, Swinburne - Hawthorn and GOTAFE in Shepparton & Wodonga.

The Dux of the College for 2008 was Glenn Gamble with an ENTER score of 84.4 – he is happy to take a GAP year to save money before he embarks on his Civil Engineering course at Swinburne.

Students preferring not to follow

the higher education road have opted for apprenticeships or traineeships (8), TAFE and part-time courses. Others, at the time of writing, are still seeking full or part time work.
